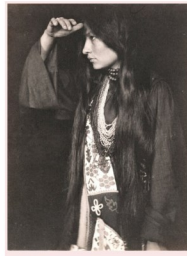
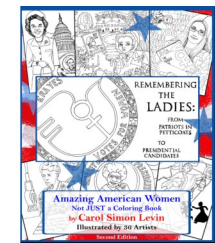

Carol shares the stories of Phyllis Wheatley, the enslaved woman who wrote a poem in honor of George Washington, noted abolitionists and women's rights speakers Maria W. Stewart, Sojourner Truth and Francis Ellen Watkins Harper, organizers and suffrage activists Ida Bell Wells-Barnett and Mary Church Terrill, Native American activists Zitkala-Sa and Marie Louise Bottineau Baldwin, migrant rights advocate Dolores Huerta and many more women of all colors and creeds who fought for women's rights and women's lives.

Carol Simon Levin is an experienced storyteller and a member of the New Jersey Storytelling Network. She has always been fascinated by the history of technology, as well as women's history.
